ROCK HILL, SOUTH CAROLINA - Winthrop University's Board of Trustees approved a new education degree to train superintendents at its June 19 meeting.

The new education specialist in educational leadership degree, which still must be approved by the S.C. Commission on Higher Education, the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, and S.C. Department of Education, will provide training for those who want to become district-level administrators.

Winthrop already has provided training for more than 300 students in the Master of Education in educational leadership program, preparing them to be school principals, assistant principals and school district administrators, according to Jennie Rakestraw, dean of the Richard W. Riley College of Education.

"Our alumni have expressed an interest in pursuing a specialist degree to ready them for the next level of leadership," Rakestraw said.

The new program will develop school district leaders by emphasizing equal education for all students, ethical behavior, advanced communication skills and interpersonal relationships.
