ROCK HILL, S.C. - **Lorraine Gorrell**, a Winthrop University music faculty member, plans to welcome the arrival of spring with a recital of inspiring **classical** and **contemporary compositions**.

Her performance at 8 p.m. on Feb. 21 in the **Frances May Barnes Recital Hall** on the Winthrop campus will feature the works of such important **16th-, 17th-, 18th- and 19th-century composers** as Claudio Monteverdi, Franz Schubert, Fanny Mendelssohn Hensel, Johannes Brahms and Roger Quilter. Gorrell also will perform compositions by 20th-century composers Tom Lopez and Gordon Myers. **Jennifer Corbell Hough**, soprano; **Craig Estep**, counter tenor; **dancer Alison Cook**; and **pianist/harpichordist Janice Bradner** will accompany Gorrell.

A professor of voice, **Gorrell** earned her B.A. at Hood College in Frederick, Md., and her M.A. and M.M. at Yale University. She has performed as a guest artist for the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation, Dutch radio and U.S. public radio and television. Also, Gorrell has presented recitals at the Cleveland Museum of Art, Merkin Concert Hall in New York and the Victoria Art Gallery in Canada, to name a few. She has published two books, "**The Nineteenth-Century German Lied**" and "**Discordant Melody: Alexander Zemlinsky, His Sons, and the Second Viennese School**," as well as a number of articles on music and voice techniques.
