ROCK HILL, S.C. - Kevin Guskiewicz, speaker for the fall 2011 [Julia H. Post Lecture](#), will discuss "[The Science of Sport Concussion: Translating Data Collection into Concussion Prevention](#)" Sept. 22.

Guskiewicz, chair of exercise and sport science at the University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill, will deliver the lecture at 11 a.m. in [Dina's Place](#). He is the Kenan Distinguished Professor and director of the [Matthew Gfeller Sport-Related Traumatic Brain Injury Research Center](#) at UNC-Chapel Hill. He also holds joint appointments in the Department of Orthopaedics, the UNC Injury Prevention Research Center and the doctoral program in human movement science at UNC-Chapel Hill. Over the past 17 years, **Guskiewicz's** clinical research program has focused on sport-related concussion.

Throughout his career, **Guskiewicz** has received 22 funded research grants, and published more than 120 manuscripts (85 peer-reviewed journal publications and eight textbook chapters on sport concussion). Since 1996, he also has presented more than 200 national and international lectures on the topic of sport-related concussion. **Guskiewicz** teaches courses in sports medicine, human anatomy and research methods in sports medicine.

The **Julia H. Post Lecture**, established in 1984, honors **Julia H. Post**, former 30-year chair of Winthrop's physical education department.
