Scope and Content Note: **The collection consists of biographical papers, correspondence, certificates, letters of recommendations, medical records, catalogues and bulletins belonging to and concerning Dr. D.B. Johnson, founder and first president of Winthrop College. There is also an extensive collection of old photographs of N.C. countryside, Winthrop campus and students and of Dr. Johnson and his family and friends. Also included in the Johnson Family Papers are correspondence, newspaper clippings, notebooks, scrapbooks, and financial papers of Mrs. D.B. Johnson, the children and other family members. This collection is an excellent source of information on the development of Winthrop College as well as on the personal life of Dr. D. B. Johnson. See also Acc. 2 & Acc. 32 (9-19).**

The series is composed of correspondence between Congressman Bradford and Dr. Johnson concerning dormitory space and the Joint Committee on Printing, which provided for the cost of printing the Winthrop catalogue.
