Scope and Content Note: **The collection consists of genealogical data, correspondence, speeches and essays, sermons, Civil War and World War I papers and memorabilia, diaries, legal and financial papers, photographs, newspaper clippings, and various papers relating to the Fewell, Caldwell, and Carothers families. The collection also contains records relating to Winthrop College, Winthrop Training School, and Salem College, Winston-Salem, N.C. Bound Volumes in the collection are scrapbooks realign to the college career of Eva M. Fewell (Carothers), and the civic and business careers of Benjamin M. Fewell and Erwin Carothers. Related by marriage, the Fewell and Carothers families have a long history of business and civic service to the city of Rock Hill. The collection represents a research source for information concerning Rock Hill, and the 1800's sermons of Reverend Cyrus K. Caldwell suggest any number of editorial and research projects for history students and scholars.**

Transfer of Items: Copies of the 1898 and 1910 copies of the *TATLER* were transferred to the archives. A copy of W. Nembhard Hibbert's *The Law of Evidence* was transferred to Acquisitions. Items from various series in the collection were transferred to the O.S. Mapcase for Manuscripts (See Separation Sheet). Duplicate items were returned to the donor.

DESCRIPTION OF CORRESPONDENCE

<u>Date(s)</u>	<u>Description</u>
1856-1864	Typed transcripts of Alex F. Fewell's letters to his wife, Martha from various Confederate encampments during his years as an officer in the Confederate army. there are some letters from the family to Fewell in the field.
1865-1892	Letters are written between various members of the Caldwell family, particularly between the daughters of Rev. Cyrus K. Caldwell. Correspondence to Anna Hope Caldwell Fewell in 1892 relates to the death of her young son, Caldwell (brother of Eva Fewell Carothers).
1907-1912	Postcards from the Jamestown Exposition of 1907 are written to Anna Fewell from daughter Eva. Letters written from Eva Fewell to her parents between 1910 and 1912 relate to college and friends. Other letters relate to travels in New York.
1913-1919	Many letters in this series of correspondence are addressed to Eva Fewell from soldiers in training at various training stations and U.S. military installations in the states. Letters also include those from young Edwin Carothers in Germany and, later, England.
1920-1929	Most letters are dated 1920 and 1921 are written by Erwin Carothers from Rock Hill and Columbia addresses where he practices law and performed his duties as a member of the S.C. House of Representatives.
1930-1947	Correspondence relates to Erwin Carothers activities as treasurer of the Rock Hill School Districts Trustees and First Federal Savings and Loan, as administrator of the Benjamin M. Fewell estate, and as mayor of Rock Hill, S.C. Related papers include a radio transcript of an interview with Mayor Carothers and Dr. Henry Sims of Winthrop.
1948-1958	Correspondence and related papers pertain to the illness and death of Erwin Carothers, and to the various resolutions and tributes honoring the much esteemed former mayor of Rock Hill. Letters of condolence to Eva Carothers and Anne Carothers Barron are also included.
1960-1971	The 1960 European postcards relate to Eva Carothers' travels abroad. Also included are letters relating to the Rock Hill YMCA and the Caldwell/Craighead genealogical research conducted by William C. Rankin of Charlotte, N.C.

3	11	DIARY OF ERWIN CAROTHERS Random entries in a diary kept during the final year of his life. Erwin Carothers of Rock Hill describes his failing health, doctor's prognoses and the social functions he attended.	1952
3	12	SPEECHES AND ESSAYS OF ERWIN CAROTHERS Erwin Carothers' addresses to the American Legion, The S.C. Building and Loan League, the Rock Hill High School graduation class of 1940, and citizens of Rock Hill. Also includes some "proclamations" signed by Erwin Carothers during his years as mayor of Rock Hill. In general chronological order.	1930-1947, nd
4	13	LEGAL PAPERS Includes land deeds, insurance policies, and an estate administrator's report. Also included are copies of the wills of Fannie Caldwell, Erwin Carothers, and Eva Fewell Carothers, and other legal papers. In chronological order.	1857-1971
4	14	FINANCIAL PAPERS Contains purchase and sales receipts and canceled checks from the financial dealings of the Fewell and Carothers families. No fixed order.	1853-1955, nd

6	20	PAPERS RELATING TO WORLD WAR I Includes Erwin Carothers' enlistment record, identification, and memorabilia related to his years as a member of the U.S. military forces in Europe during WWI. (For other information, see "Correspondence" from 1917-1919) No fixed order.	1917-1919
6-7	21-23	PAPERS RELATING TO PRESBYTERIAN CHURCHES Folders 21 and 22 include church histories relating to the Rock Hill Presbyterian Church, the Ebenezer Presbyterian Church, the First Presbyterian Church of Rock Hill, and the Oakland Avenue Presbyterian Church, a long with other papers relating to local Presbyterian affiliations and congregations. Folder 23 contains a sampling of church bulletins from the churches. In general chronological order.	1894-1970, nd
7	24	PAPERS RELATING TO WINTHROP COLLEGE Includes the grade reports of Eva M. Fewell, a sewing notebook from one of the classes, a 1911 Diploma (transferred to O.S. Mapcase), "My Thanksgiving Book" by Anne Carothers (when she was a kindergarten student at Winthrop Training School), and a bulletin from the "Inauguration of Dr. Henry Radcliffe Sims." 7	25	PAPERS RELATING TO SALEM COLLEGE Includes correspondence, play programs, newspaper clippings, grade reports, and memorabilia relating to Anne Carothers' career at Salem College in Winston-Salem, N.C. In chronological order.	1944-1948
