Charlotte Minister to Speak on Imani at Dec. 1 Kwanzaa Celebration

ROCK HILL, S.C. - The **Rev. Trevor Beauford '00**, a ministerial staff member at **Friendship Missionary Baptist Church** in Charlotte, N.C., will be the keynote speaker for the 2010 **Kwanzaa celebration** Dec. 1.

Beauford, who is DeiVision Minister for Children, Youth and Singles at the church, will speak on Imani, or "faith," which is one of the seven principles of **Kwanzaa**. This year's 7 p.m. celebration in the **DiGiorgio Campus Center ballroom** will include **Beauford's** speech and performances by the WU Vision of Prayze Gospel Choir and the Association of Ebonites Dance Team. A short reception will follow at 8 p.m.

Beauford is an ordained minister who also serves as director of the Friendship Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools Volunteers Initiative and as a liaison to CMS schools. He is a member of the leadership teams of the American Baptist Churches, USA and the International Youth Development Department Team for the Lott Carey Baptist Foreign Mission Convention. He earned his B.A. in history at Winthrop and his M.Div. at Howard University. In addition, **Beauford** is a member of Leadership Charlotte; a mentor and active CMS volunteer; a member of the of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity; co-chairman of the Beta Nu Lambda Foundation Beautillion Program; and part of the Mecklenburg County Young Democrats. Beauford serves on the Board of Directors for Freedom School Partners, Mecklenburg County Kids Voting and the Winthrop University Alumni Association.

Kwanzaa, a non-religious celebration founded in 1966, is based on seven principles: unity, self-determination, collective work and responsibility, cooperative economics, purpose, creativity and faith. The principle of Imani signifies "believing in our people, our families, our educators, our leaders and the righteousness of the African-American struggle." Traditionally celebrated Dec. 26-Jan. 1, **Kwanzaa** is celebrated before Christmas break at Winthrop.
