ROCK HILL, SOUTH CAROLINA - **Audrey Masson**, a French student in the mass communication department's **integrated marketing communication program** at Winthrop University, has won not only a prestigious honor, but also scholarship money for her excellent work during her internship.

Masson interned this summer for **American Textile Recycling Services** in Chino, California, and enjoyed the distinction of being recognized as the "Outstanding Intern." She earned this honor by winning weekly public relations strategizing projects that were given to all interns. American Textile Recycling Services is excited about this honor and is planning a publicity blitz to announce the news in its

industry.

This fall Masson was presented with a \$1,000 scholarship check for tuition.

Sarah DeCarlo, Masson's supervisor, commissioned a giant check to be sent to Winthrop for a media/photo session. The check presentation was featured in the campus news program, Winthrop Close-Up. "We are very impressed with Audrey's work over the summer," said DeCarlo.
