"One lesson is that things always work out in the end, maybe not in the way you expect, but they do work out," Gill said. "Another lesson is the importance of family. Families can be confusing and aggravating but at the end of the day, the families in the show are there for each other both in the big and small moments."

This play features mild adult themes and languages.
