Scope and Content Note: **This collection consists of correspondence, land plots and deeds, Fifth Regiment "E" Company Roll of the South Carolina Volunteers, program pamphlet, journal, family papers, a photograph, and recollections by John Daniel McConnell of his service in the Confederate Army during the American Civil War. All of the material primarily relates to the McConnell family members in North and South Carolina, but also contains some material from families located in other states. All of the material is in original form. The collection bulks largest between the dates 1889 and 1954.**

1	1-5	<p>McCONNELL FAMILY CORRESPONDENCE</p> <p>Consists of correspondence between family members and friends. There is also a child's storybook. Most of the correspondence was addressed to Reuben McConnell and concerns his health, money situation, and the family farm. Of particular interest are two letters and a speech. One letter, dated January 24, 1901, dealt with the reign of Queen Victoria; the other, dated December 4, 1937, discussed the New Deal farm program in the South. The speech was on "The Influence of Woman." The series is in chronological order.</p>	1889-1954, nd
1	6	<p>LAND DEEDS AND LAND PLATS</p> <p>Includes a land plat of Joseph Guthrie and three land deeds. The three deeds concern land given or received by the Bratton family. The Guthrie plat is followed by an undated deed and two 1954 deeds, respectively.</p>	1816, 1854, nd
1	7	<p>FIFTH REGIMENT "E" COMPANY ROLL</p> <p>Roll of Company "E" of the Fifth Regiment of the South Carolina Volunteers in the confederate States provisional army. Roll includes name, age, county, where died or wounded, where surrendered, and promotions with dates. Also includes a journal containing two essays. The journal follows the roll.</p>	nd
1	8	<p>PUBLICATIONS</p> <p>An official program of Independence Day celebrations in 1941 in McConnellsville (McConnells), S.C. Also a newspaper article on the tax levied on the farmers of the South by the Confederate government called a "Tax in Kind." A pamphlet entitled, "Southern Battlefields," lists the battlefields on or near the Nashville, Chattanooga and St. Louis Railway and the Western and Atlantic Railway lines. This pamphlet also describes a few of the more important battles in those areas. These items are found in the order listed.</p>	1941, nd
