# Bechtler Ensemble and Out of Bounds Ensemble Join Forces for Charlotte Composers Forum Concerts

ROCK HILL, S.C. - The newly formed **Charlotte Composers Forum** will present concerts on Oct. 20 at [Winthrop University](#), with a repeat performance on Oct. 27 at the [Bechtler Museum of Modern Art](#) in Charlotte, N.C.

The **Charlotte Composers Forum** was initiated by **Alan Yamamoto**, bringing together two established contemporary groups in the metro area, the **Bechtler Ensemble** and the Out of Bounds Ensemble.

The **Charlotte Composers Forum's mission** is to bring Charlotte area composers' music to a wider audience in the Charlotte region and provide opportunities for community outreach and engagement.

The concerts will feature works by Charlotte area composers **Ronald Keith Parks** (Simple Things), **Craig Bove** (Broken Being), and **John Allemeier** (Solstice). Additionally, **Alan Yamamoto's** arrangement of **Gustav Mahler's Rückert Lieder** will be premiered.

All works will be performed by the combined forces of the **Bechtler Ensemble** and the **Out of Bounds Ensemble**. This will be the first time that the ensembles have joined forces for a performance.

Both concerts will be multi-media events and will feature local vocal soloists **Rebecca Cook-Carter** and **Virginia Gutierrez**, joined by numerous other Charlotte area musicians.

"**Simple Things**," written by Winthrop music faculty member **Ron Parks**, was created as part of the **Charlotte Symphony Orchestra's Composer in the Schools Project**. It is a setting of text adapted from a letter his father wrote to his mother on Parks' second birthday and will be sung by **Virginia Gutierrez**.
