Scope and Content Note: **The Junior Woman's Club of Rock Hill (JWC) has served the Rock Hill community since 1955 as a "not for profit" philanthropic volunteer organization. During its fifty plus years of service, JWC has accomplished many things such as assisting in the beginning of the Adult Education program, Rock Hill Day Care Center for mentally Retarded Children, and the Girls' Home of Rock Hill. The JWC is a member of the General Federation of Women's Clubs and the General Federation of Women's Clubs of South Carolina.**

The records contain a historical file, minutes, correspondence, membership lists, financial records, project reports, newsletters, yearbook and thirty-seven scrapbooks relating to the growth, activities and community contributions of the Rock Hill Junior Women's Club from 1955 to 2003.
