These minutes include discussion of club activities, events, and projects in addition of actions taken during the meeting. Minutes after 1979 are kept in their original binders for organizational purposes.</p> <p>*This series is arranged chronologically.</p>	1955-2001, 2007
2	5	<p>FRANCES LLOYD DAY PHOTOGRAPHS AND RELATED MATERIAL</p> <p>These photographs commemorate the celebration of Frances Lloyd receiving a permanent associate membership in recognition for her dedication and service to the club. In addition, the club designated September 16th as Frances Lloyd Day to further honor her contributions to the club. In addition, there is a proclamation to officiate this decision by the club.</p>	2009
2	6-9	<p>NEWSPAPER CLIPPINGS--SCRAPBOOK</p> <p>The clippings enclosed in this section have been pulled from Their respective scrapbooks in an effort to preserve them.</p> <p>From the 'second' scrapbook (larger one with brown string covering dates of mid 1960s to mid 1980s) are the following clippings: 1955 announcement of the creation of the club, 1961 announcement of new officers, 1962 holiday preparation, 1964 flower show, 1965 flower show as well as new officers and 10th anniversary, and finally an undated clipping announcing new officers. In addition, there were also handwritten notes on the history of the club, how to make a flower arrangement, a document on the 1966 flower show, and 'awards' given to members of the club.</p> <p>From the 'third' scrapbook (smaller, white book largely covering dates of 1986 to 1996) are clippings from a 1983 luncheon, a parade in 2002, as well as the 50th anniversary of the club. This included many photos from the event as well as six identical headlines from the Herald noting this event. The Herald clippings are from April 21st and May 5th 2005.</p> <p>From the 'fourth' scrapbook its entire contents (mainly yearbooks) have been photographically documented and has also been placed into folders in order to protect it.</p> <p>*This series has been arranged chronologically</p>	1955-1970, 1983, 2002, 2005, nd 1955-1970, nd 1983, 2002, 2005 1955-2009

Bd. Vol. 1		CLUB SCRAPBOOK Includes four scrapbooks (one of which was transferred to Folder 8) containing photos and clippings related to club functions. The ‘first’ and ‘third’ scrapbooks have been placed into box 3. The clippings detail not only member involvement in the community, but also participation in various gardening contests and events. In addition, there are also small yearbooks included in the scrapbooks. Contents have been left as the creator placed them in their respective years. ***’First’ Scrapbook (green colored—1955-1966), ‘Second’ Scrapbook (largest of the four, held together by brown string, and Says “scrapbook” on the front cover—1966-1985), ‘Third’ Scrapbook (smaller, white—1986-2002), ‘Fourth’ Scrapbook (blue covered—1955-2009 and mainly deals with yearbooks over the years—was pulled out of binder and placed into ‘Folder 8’). *Stored on top of the corresponding collection boxes and labeled according to item descriptions in the above note.	1955-2009
