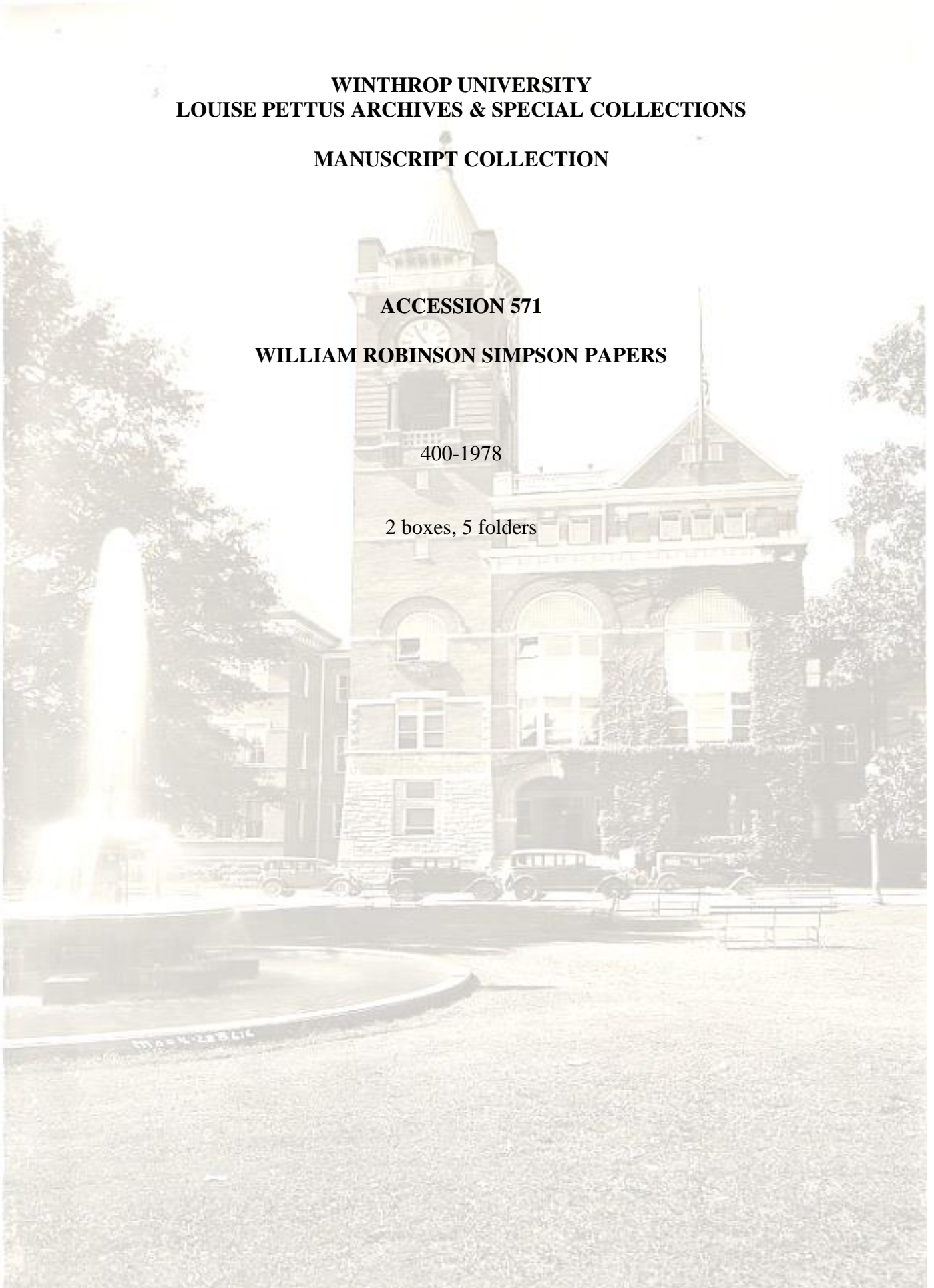




Scope and Content Note: **The William Robinson Simpson Papers consists of photocopies of materials collected by William Robinson Simpson, Jr. (1902-1993) that relate primarily to line of the Simpson Family descended from John Simpson, Sr. (1770-1834). The collection consists primarily with genealogical materials related to the Simpson, Pride, Jones, and Sitgreaves families based mostly in Chester County, SC and York County, SC from the 1800s-1978s. Some of the genealogies extend as far back 400 AD. The collection consists entirely of photocopies of correspondence, receipts, ledger entries, legal documents (wills, power of attorney, etc.), newspaper articles, photographs, family narratives and biographies, and lineage charts.**

Also, included is information on the "Wyoming Plantation" located off of Highway 21 near Landsford Canal which was built around 1813 and was the ancestral home of the Pride Family. There is also some information on "Asheland" the former home and birthplace of Anna Ross Pride which still exists on Hutchison Street in Rock Hill SC which was built in 1871 making it one of the 3 or 4 oldest homes in the City.
