

Scope and Content Note: **The Jim and Ann Casada Cookbook Collection includes five cookbooks written by Jim and Ann Casada, four of them pertain to cooking wild game while the other one is for grilling. The collection also includes the notes, materials, and research used to write the cookbooks, floppy disks copies and hard copies of drafts, newspaper and magazine clippings of recipes, and recipe drafts to be re-done for the cookbooks. Dr. James “Jim” Allen Casada (1942-) was a history professor at Winthrop University from 1971 to 1996 and was Winthrop’s first men’s soccer coach. He coached the Winthrop Soccer Team for twelve seasons from 1975-1986.**

BIOGRAPHICAL DATA

DR. JAMES ALLEN “JIM” CASADA

Jim Casada, who was born January 28, 1942, is a son of the Smokies. He grew up in Bryson City, NC and cut his sporting teeth hunting and fishing in and around this small mountain town. He says “a corner of my heart” still belongs to the high country.

Jim earned a B. A. in history from King College, Bristol, TN (1964), an M. A. in British history from Virginia Tech (1968), and a Ph. D. in British imperial history from Vanderbilt University (1972). He taught history at Winthrop University in Rock Hill, SC (where he still lives) from 1971-1996 before taking early retirement to work as a full-time freelance writer/photographer. While at Winthrop he rose to the rank of tenured full professor, was recognized as the institution’s Distinguished Professor (1983), and served two terms as chairman of the graduate faculty. He is a founding member and past president of the South Carolina Outdoor Press Association, a member and past president (two terms) of the Southeastern Outdoor Press Association, founding board member of the Professional Outdoor Media Association, and past president of the Outdoor Writers Association of America.



He has won almost two hundred craft awards for his writing and photography, is an Honorary Life Member and recipient of the Arnold Gingrich Memorial Award of the Federation of Fly Fishers, was an inaugural inductee into the Fly Fishing Museum of the Southern Appalachians Hall of Fame, in 2007 he was recognized by the National Wild Turkey Federation as its Communicator of the Year and is a member of the Athletic Hall of Fame of Swain County High School (basketball) and Winthrop University (soccer coach).¹
