Scope and Content Note: **The Drummond Family Military Uniforms Collection consists of uniforms worn by Warren Howell Drummond (1889-1950) and James Lamar Drummond (1900-1982). Warren Howell Drummond served in the US Navy during World War I and the collection contains his jacket, belt and pants. James Drummond served in the US Army during World War II and the collection contains green wool trench coat, pants, cap, uniform jackets, vest, and colored shirts. The Drummond family is from Woodruff, South Carolina.**

1	Army	GREEN WOOL TRENCH COAT -Olive green color, with eight large and two small army emblem brass buttons	1940s
2	Army	CAP -Olive green color, the tag on the inside says "Philadelphia Uniform Company" made on February 9, 1942. It is a size 7 1/4.	1942
3	Army	UNIFORM JACKET -Olive green color, with four large and two small army emblem brass buttons. The patch on the left shoulder 4 th Service Command.	1940s
4	Army	PANTS -Two pairs of pants, both Olive green in color.	1940s
5	Army	UNIFORM JACKET -Olive green color, with four large and six small army emblem brass buttons. The patch repeated on both arms is for rank, James Drummond was a Technician Fifth Grade. The patch at the bottom of the right sleeve is for overseas service with each stripe representing six months of constant overseas service. The patch on the top right shoulder is for the Western Pacific Unit, who spent their time in the war in the Asian Pacific area. The patch over the right breast pocket is the honorable discharge emblem. The ribbons over the left breast pocket are as follows: red and white stripes- Army Good Conduct Medal; red, yellow, and white stripes- Asiatic-Pacific Campaign Medal; red and rainbow- World War II Victory Medal.	1940s
6	Army	VEST -Tan in color, brown buttons with multiple pockets, with a larger pocket on the back.	1940s
7	Army	COLLARED SHIRTS -One khaki and one olive green shirts. Multiple pockets, made from gabardine, and the buttons are no longer attached. The tan shirt has a ranking patch on both arms of a Private First Class.	1940s

8	Navy	JACKET -Olive green color, with two pockets and brown buttons.	1910s
9	Navy	BELT -Black leather belt. This was usually worn with their jeans or dungarees when working below deck.	1910s
10	Navy	PANTS -Two pairs of pants, one white and one blue. The white pair is part of an undress whites uniform, this was worn for in hot or topical destinations or when work needed to be done above deck. The blue pants are from the dungaree service uniform, this was worn when work needed to be done below deck or during the men's free time below deck. The dungaree uniform was not supposed to be worn above deck.	1910s
