Scope and Content Note: **This collection consists of David Andrew Epting's correspondence and artifacts. Most of the material pertains to Epting's career and experience in the United States Navy, the Naval Reserves. Most notably is Epting's correspondence that includes letters to him from his family and friends. The letters from his family and friends to Epting give a very good description of the Home Front in South Carolina during WWII. The collection of letters is separated into two parts, one from family and one from friends. Both sections are arranged chronologically. Epting's mother, Annie Davis Epting, was a 1909 graduate of Winthrop.**

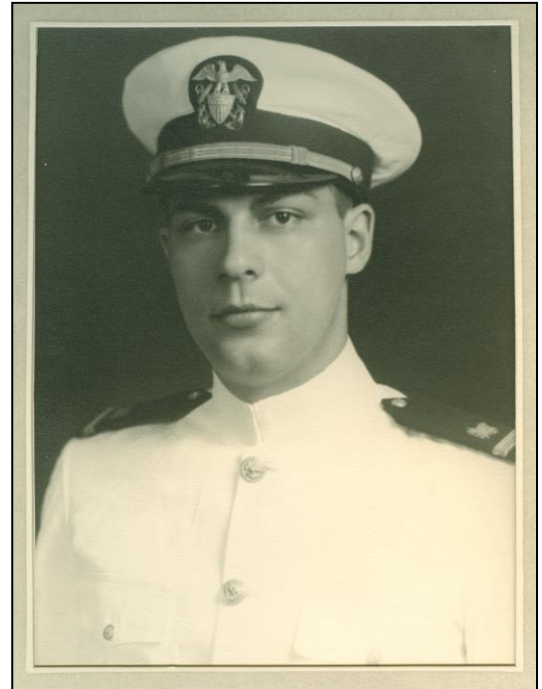

- 1982 Retired as Treasury Cashier from Southern Bell Telephone Company
- 2012 Died at age 90
