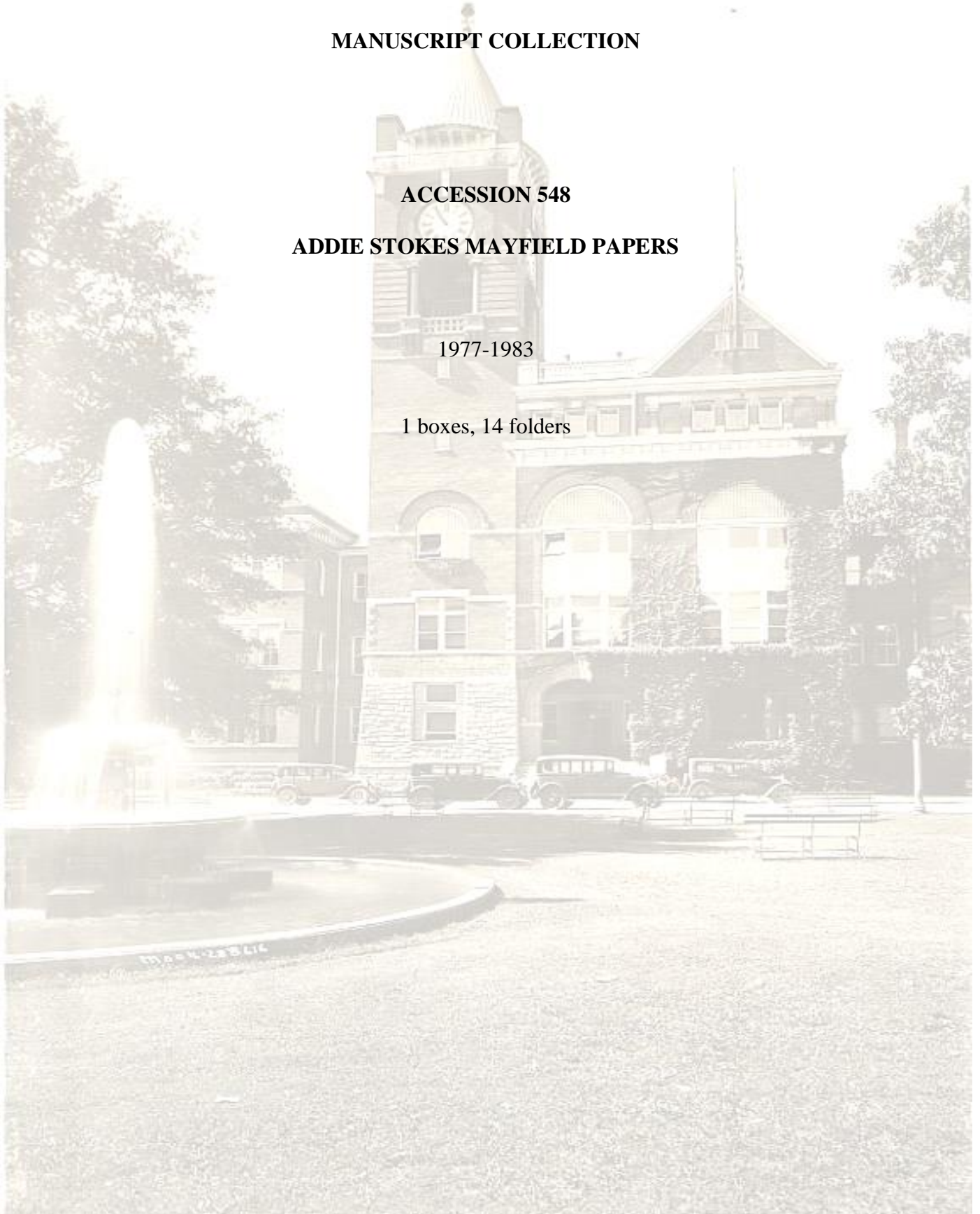

Scope and Content Note: **The Addie Stokes Mayfield Papers consist mostly of photocopies of genealogical material collected and prepared by Winthrop Training School graduate (1933) and Winthrop College graduate (1937) Addie Stokes Mayfield (1916-1999) related to the Moore, Stokes, Rawlinson, Hutchinson, Caldwell, Springs, and Baxter families primarily from Rock Hill, SC. The genealogical entries span mostly from 1791 to 1983. The materials consists of biographical data and narratives on family members, lineage and family charts, genealogical notes, bible entries, correspondence and applications to the Huguenot Society of South Carolina, Daughters of the American Revolution, and the Children of the Confederacy, etc., and nomination of the Stokes-Mayfield House (Rock Hill, South Carolina) to the National Register of Historic Places. The subjects of the biographical sketches include Dr. James Richmond Stokes (1877-1949), Harriet Baxter Rawlinson (1849-1933), Joel Woodward Rawlinson (1822-1888), Jane Moore Rawlinson (1820-1892), Addie Hutchinson Rawlinson Stokes (1883-1960), Walter Joel Rawlinson (1845-1928), Addie Hutchinson Caldwell Rawlinson (1851-1884), Dr. William Shakespeare Moore (1791-1867), and Harriet Baxter Springs Moore (1802-1832).**

1	1	THE BOOK OF STOKES This series includes a pamphlet tracing the history of the Stokes family from ancient Morman origins to those of the family name born up to 1911. Particular attention is paid to the Stokes' first arrival in America and the beginnings of the family in South Carolina. Also included is one letter from William C. Stokes of Reidville to Mrs. H. Learue (Addie) Mayfield (1916-1999).	1981
1	2	WILLIAM STOKES (1833-1905) AND ELIZA JANE BOULWARE STOKES (1837-1916) GENEALOGY This series contains short biographies written by Addie Stokes Mayfield of the Stokes family from 1833-1980 with additional emphasis on the Boulware family, which became related to the Stokes through the marriage (1856) of Eliza Jane Boulware (1837-1916) to William Stokes (1833-1905). Excerpts from the Civil War diary of Colonel William Stokes are included along with miscellaneous maps.	1980
1	3	SKETCH OF DR. JAMES RICHMOND STOKES (1877-1949) This series contains a biography written by Addie Stokes Mayfield of Dr. James Richmond Stokes, a prominent Rock Hill citizen who was a member of the Rock Hill Board of Health. Also includes newspaper clippings and correspondence.	1978
1	4	VARIOUS RECORDS AND CORRESPONDENCE OF ADDIE STOKES MAYFIELD (1916-1999) This series contains applications to the Huguenot Society of South Carolina by Addie Stokes Mayfield (1916-1999) and an application for membership from Addie Caldwell Mayfield (1946-) to the Children of the Confederacy. Also within is correspondence pertaining to the acquisition of official documents from the South Carolina Archives in Columbia, SC.	1980
1	5	PAPERS RELATING TO THE NOMINATION OF THE STOKES-MAYFIELD HOUSE TO THE NATIONAL REGISTER This series consists of supporting letters written by Phil Lader and an application by Addie Stokes Mayfield to the National Register of Historic Places in order to have the "Stokes-Mayfield" house (353 Oakland Avenue) placed on the National Register.	1983

1	8	SKETCH OF JOEL WOODWARD RAWLINSON (1822-1888) AND JANE MOORE RAWLINSON (1820-1892) This series contains biographies of J. W. Rawlinson and his wife, Jane Moore Rawlinson. Also contains date of births and deaths of their six children, with a photocopy and a typescript copy of an article written by J.W. Rawlinson for the <i>Yorkville Enquirer</i> (March 11, 1858) concerning plantation management. Also of interest is a photocopied letter from Frederick Edward Moore (1835-1861) (half-brother of Jane) dated December 5, 1861 and Frederick Edward Moore's obituary in the <i>Yorkville Enquirer</i> (January 9, 1862).	1978
1	9	SKETCH OF ADDIE HUTCHINSON RAWLINSON STOKES (1883-1960) This series contains a biographical sketch written by Addie Stokes Mayfield of Addie Hutchinson Rawlinson Stokes (1883-1960) and photocopies of the "Society Page" from the <i>Yorkville Enquirer</i> and obituaries for Mrs. Stokes.	1978
1	10	SKETCH OF WALTER JOEL RAWLINSON (1845-1928) AND ADDIE HUTCHISON CALDWELL RAWLINSON (1851-1884) This series contains a short biography of Mr. and Mrs. Rawlinson written by Addie Stokes Mayfield, as well as photocopied pieces of correspondence.	1977
