1	1	ROCK HILL ARCHITECTURAL AND HISTORICAL INVENTORY SURVEY REPORT This series consists of a 26 page report conducted by Preservation Consultants, Inc. and administered by the South Carolina Department of Archives and History in 1988 titled <i>Rock Hill South Carolina Architectural and Historical Inventory 1988: Survey Report</i> . The South Carolina Inventory of Historic Places was a statewide survey of districts, sites, objects, buildings, and structures of architectural or historical significance. The survey was part of a national effort to identify significant historic resources throughout the country. “The basic objectives of the survey are to identify significant historic resources, to document these resources through historical research and fieldwork, and to organize this information for later use.”	1988

This survey is a supplement to the regular report that focuses on the Mills and Mill Villages of Rock Hill. 1	3	<p>CITY OF ROCK HILL HISTORIC RESOURCES SURVEY UPDATE</p> <p>This series consists of a 177 page update on the 1988 survey conducted Preservation Consultants, Inc. which was prepared by Edwards-Pitman Environmental, Inc. in August 2004. The survey was sponsored by the City of Rock Hill and the South Carolina Department of Archives and History. The project objectives in the survey were stated as: “EPE (Edwards-Pitman Environmental, Inc.) architectural historians undertook the City of Rock Hill Historic Resources Survey Update as part of the SCDAH Statewide Survey of Historic Places, which forms the basis of the historic preservation program in the state. The primary objectives of the survey program are to gather, organize, and present information about historic properties in photographs, narratives, maps, and drawings in order to identify properties eligible for the National Register of Historic Places and to identify properties eligible for potential local historic designation. During the survey, the historians sought to identify historic resources, record their locations, and evaluate their significance in a local, statewide, and national context. This project will promote a richer understanding of the city’s historical and architectural development and encourage economic incentives for rehabilitation, cultural tourism development, education, and local compliance with state and federal preservation and environmental laws.”</p>	2004
