Scope and Content Note: The papers of Hugh E. Henry provide various looks into what the Henry family of Chester County held close. You will find newspaper clippings detailing high school reunions ranging from 1938-1942 as well as sporting team photographs. There are three Chester High School yearbooks in the collection: 1939, 1940, and 1941. Within the collection are a plethora of newspaper clippings that contain obituaries of Chester High School students and faculty who attended the school from 1938-1941 as well as an obituary for former Mayor Mr. Edward Hood Dawson of Chester County. Mr. Hugh E. Henry attended the Associate Presbyterian Church and held handbooks, programs and pamphlets from 1959 through 1973. A smaller part of the collection involves the Chester County courthouse. A newspaper clipping from 2000 has an article of William Knox reporting a lost plaque at the courthouse. Also within the collection are negatives of the 1942 Chester fire, a 1932 map of the South Carolina State Highway System, and two pages of a Winthrop College Orchestra program from 1943.

-This series consists of Chester, SC *News And Reporter* newspaper clippings ranging from 1984-1996. The clippings have sections titled, "Faces From the Past" which highlight Chester High School reunions. The featured reunions are for the classes of 1938, 1939, 1940, 1941, 1942, 1943, and 1947. The 1943 class also features a full color print of the newspaper photo, and a pamphlet for that year's graduation ceremony. The 1940 reunion photo is from a newspaper clipping dated 1990. The clipping was found on page 26 of the 1940 yearbook. W. Carlisle White Jr. is featured in the newspaper clipping, and his senior photo can be found on page 26.

# 1 2 CHESTER HIGH SCHOOL SPORTS & ACTIVITIES

1943, 1992, 1993, 2000

- -This folder contains a scanned photo of the 1907-1908 Chester High School baseball team. Also included is a letter written in 1993 that describes and identifies the roster.
- -A 2000 printing of the 1943 Chester, *SC News And Reporter* newspaper clipping that is also titled Faces From the Past, but features the 1943 Chester High School football team as opposed to the class reunions of folder 1.
- -Also included is the first page of a screenplay titled *George Washington Slept Here* from the 1943 class. As well as the first page of the 1943 style show from the Home Economics Department.
- -There is a newspaper clipping titled *Style Show For A Queen* which advertises this same 1943 style show.
- -A newspaper clipping dated September 23, 1992 was found within the 1940 Yearbook on page 62. It is a "Faces from the Past" article featuring the boxing team of Chester High School in 1940. The photo in the newspaper clipping is the same photo used in the 1940 yearbook on page 62.

# 1 3 CHESTER CITY

This folder contains a newspaper clipping from April 19, 2000 that involves Robert Knox reporting a missing plaque that was at the Chester Courthouse. There is also a printed scan of a newspaper clipping titled *Spirited Bidding in Chester*. Which highlights a bidding on land sales from ca. 1940. Also enclosed is a book titled, *Images of America – Chester County*. Written by Glinda Price Coleman and Gina Price White, the book has over 200 photographs and explores Chester County's history and geography.

# 1 4 ASSOCIATE REFORMED PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

1959, 1966, 1973, nd

This series consists of material related to the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church in Chester, SC.

- -This series includes an original typed (typewriter) Easter Special reading delivered to ARP Mens Bible class on March 29, 1959.
- -Also, one pamphlet agenda from February 20, 1966 detailing the Activities taking place at the church in that coming week. The front of the pamphlet adorns the official seal of the church and the tag line "In thy light shall we see light." The back of the pamphlet is a description of the official seal, going over each asset of the seal in detail on their meaning and purpose.
- -Also contained in this series is a handbook from 1973, which details leaders of the Church Woman's Society and key dates throughout each month including member birthdays.
- -In this folder is another reading from the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church. Unlike the Easter Special, this reading is not dated, but it does contain a headline *Albert T. Henry*.

# 1 8 NEWPAPER ARTICLES

This series consists of newspaper articles, mostly found in Chester High School yearbooks and are related to the Chester High School students. Below is an item level inventory:

- 1. A newspaper article titled "Jet Trip 'Comfortable' For Chester's Judge Henry" from 1960 most likely from the *Chester Reporter*. The article is a brief recounting quoted by A. T. Henry of his trip by jet and includes a very brief biography of Henry.
- 2. Two newspaper articles about Justice George T. Gregory found on page 19 of the 1939 yearbook. The first is titled "Memorial Day Tribute" (May 28, 1999) and includes a reflection of George Gregory on the memory of his brother William Gregory. The second article is titled "Spring Boosts Libraries" (March 8, 2000) about a check presentation from the Springs Foundation to the Library for \$1,000.
- 3. A newspaper article titled "Outstanding Program" (June 11, 1972) was found on page 13 of the 1939 Chester High School Yearbook. The article is related to the Manning Correctional Institute in Columbia after it was recognized for their educational program.
- 4. A newspaper article from the Faces from the Past Series that was found on page 22 of the 1940 Chester High School yearbook. The article includes a group photograph that includes Ms. Edith Eileen Pressley whose yearbook photograph was on page 22.
- 5. Two newspaper articles found on page 20 of the 1941 Chester High School Yearbook. The first article titled "Spreading Cheer" (January 14, 1998) which is related to Ms. Sarah Huey (Sara Margaret Plyler) and the Pilot Club of Chester. The second article clipping is titled "Passing the Gavel" (July 23, 1999) which concerns Ms. Sarah Huey who was passing her role of president of the Pilot Club to Dot Welcher. Ms. Sarah Huey's photograph is also on page 20 where the article was found.
- 6. A newspaper article related to a formal party of Chester High School students and faculty from April 28, 1993 that was found on page 24 of the 1941 Chester High School Yearbook.
- 7. A newspaper article (March 11, 1992) announcing the 50 year wedding anniversary for Mr. and Mrs. Neil Grant Alexander Sr. Maiden name Faye Yarborough can be found on page 26 of the 1941 Chester High School yearbook where the article was found. March 11, 1992.
