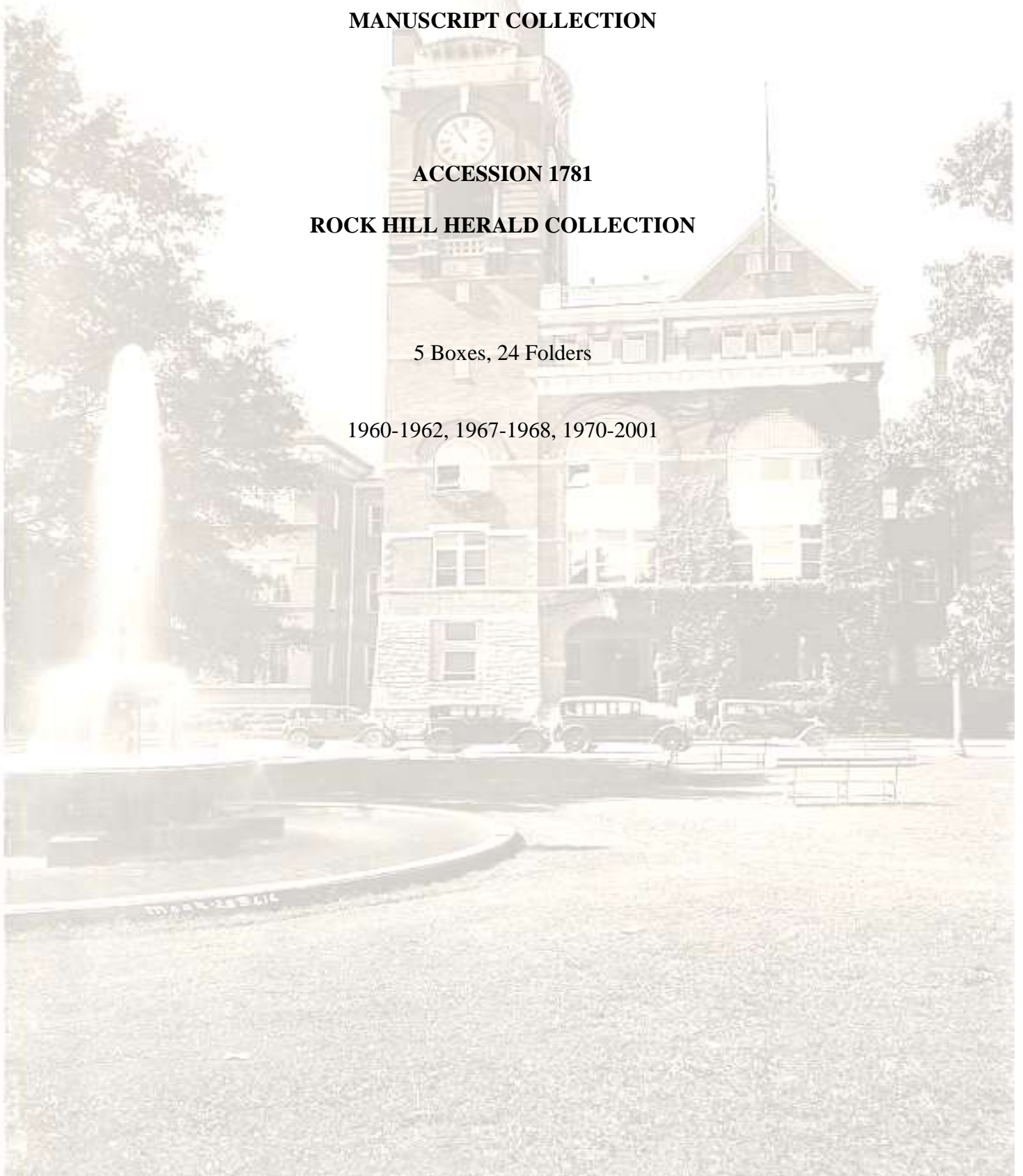

1	4	REVEREND JERRY FALWELL This series consists of photographs of Rev. Jerry Falwell, who was a televangelist, pastor, and co-founder of Liberty University (1971). Some of these photographs have newspaper clips attached to the back. Jerry Laymon Falwell Sr. was born in Virginia in 1933. He was Jim Bakker's successor as head of the PTL television network in 1987, but within the year it went bankrupt.	1987, nd
1	5	DR. JOSEPH GENTRY This series consists of photographs, negatives, and contact sheets pertaining to Dr. Gentry and his role as a Rock Hill School District Three Superintendent (1980-1993). Joseph Edgar Gentry was born on August 4, 1931. As well as working as the Rock Hill Superintendent, Dr. Gentry was previously a teacher, principal, district administrator, and later he was also the President of the South Carolina Association of School Superintendents. 1	6	VERNON GRANT This series contains photographs, negatives, contact sheets, and copies of illustrations pertaining to Vernon Grant, who was an illustrator from Rock Hill, South Carolina. Grant also served as the Rock Hill Chamber of Commerce director and was one of the founders of the Rock Hill's Come-See-Me Festival as well as the creator of the festival's mascot, Glen the frog. He was a Winthrop Training School graduate and served in the South Carolina House of Representatives (1981-1984), South Carolina Senate (1985-1990), and as a York County Circuit Court Judge (1991-2017). As a judge, he had the opportunity to vacate the convictions of the Friendship Nine in 2015; sentences that had been given by his late uncle, Billy Hayes. Hayes also served as a United States Army Reservist for six years in his youth. John C. Hayes III was born on October 18, 1945 and died on April 7, 2023 in Rock Hill, South Carolina.	1987, 1989, 1991, nd
2	7-8	ERNEST F. HOLLINGS This series contains photographs, negatives, contact sheets, and newspaper clips, both originals and photocopies, pertaining to Ernest Frederick "Fritz" Hollings who was a U.S. Senator (1966-2005) and a South Carolina Governor (1959-1963). Manning Kimmel is a co-owner and managing partner of a broadcasting company and he, along with his father Edward "Ned" Kimmel, made an effort to tell the true story of his grandfather.	1995, n.d.
2-3	10-11	PHILIP AND LINDA LADER This series consists of photographs with descriptions and newspaper clips on the back, negatives, contact sheets, newspaper clips, and color slides pertaining to the Lader family and Philip Lader's positions as Winthrop College President (1983-1985), and later the Deputy Chief of Staff at the White House (1993-1994) and the U.S. ambassador to the U.K. (1997-2001). 4	21	ALBRIGHT, CLARENCE HOLLAND Clarence Holland "Icky" Albright was born in Clinton, SC in 1906. Albright was a city councilman (1940-1944), a mayor of Rock Hill, SC (1948-1954), and a South Carolina State Senator (1966-1968). He was also a realtor, an insurance executive, a businessman and one of the founders of Rock Hill's Come-See-Me Festival. He died on January 31, 2000 and is buried in Rock Hill, SC.
4	21	ARMSTRONG, W. R. W. R. Armstrong was a mayor of Rock Hill, SC (1921).
4	21	BARNWELL, JOHN GIBBES John Gibbes Barnwell Sr. was born in September of 1883. Barnwell was the first city manager of Rock Hill, SC (1915-1919) after Rock Hill approved the council-manager form of government in 1913. He died on July 18, 1970 and is buried in Rock Hill, SC.
4	21	BLANKENSHIP, VADER B. Vader B. Blankenship Sr. was born in York, SC in 1872. Blankenship was a mayor of Rock Hill, SC (1918-1920). He died in 1933 and is buried in Rock Hill, SC.
4	21	DUNLAP, HERBERT MCCULLOUGH Herbert McCullough Dunlap Sr. was born in Lancaster, SC in 1875. Dunlap was a mayor of Rock Hill, SC (1933). He also served during the Spanish American War (ca. 1898). Herbert Dunlap Sr. died on January 15, 1934 and is buried in Rock Hill, SC.
4	21	FEWELL, DR. JOHN WILLIAM Dr. John William Fewell was born in York, SC in 1847. Dr. Fewell was the first "mayor" of Rock Hill, SC (1893-1895). Before Fewell, mayors were called intendants. He died on March 24, 1895 and is buried in Rock Hill, SC.
4	21	GOODMAN, WILLIAM PULASKI William Pulaski Goodman Sr. was born in Walhalla, SC in 1882. Goodman was a city manager in Rock Hill, SC (1921-1933). He died on August 28, 1949 and is buried in Rock Hill, SC.

4	21	<p>HARDIN, JOHN ANDERSON John Anderson Hardin was born in Rock Hill, SC in 1920. He was a Rock Hill councilman (1954-1957), the mayor of Rock Hill for three terms (1958-1964), and served on numerous other committees, boards, and organizations, serving his community until 2009. He was greatly responsible for the creation and development of the Rock Hill Airport and the Glencarin Gardens. He also served in the United States Navy from 1942-1945. John Anderson Hardin died in May 10, 2010 and is buried in Rock Hill, SC.</p>
4	21	<p>HARDIN, JAMES CARLISLE James Carlisle Hardin was born in Batesburg, SC in 1887. He founded the Rock Hill Body Company and a mayor of Rock Hill, SC (1915). He was also John Anderson Hardin's father. He died on January 18, 1943 and is buried in Rock Hill, SC.</p>
4	21	<p>HOLLAND, MAX Max Holland was born in 1923. Holland was a city manager in Rock Hill, SC. (1965-1979). He died on November 10, 1992 and is buried in Rock Hill, SC.</p>
4	21	<p>HULL, J. J. J. J. Hull was born in 1851. He was a mayor of Rock Hill, SC (1903-1905), and he was also a publisher for the Weekly Herald (1883-1905). He died in 1905 and is buried in Rock Hill, SC.</p>
4	21	<p>HUTCHINSON, WILLIAM CAMPBELL William Campbell Hutchinson was born in 1858. Hutchinson was a mayor of Rock Hill, SC (1896-1898). He died on April 14, 1931 and is buried in Rock Hill, SC.</p>
4	21	<p>JACOCKS, FRANCIS ATHERTON Francis Atherton Jacocks was born in 1908. Jacocks was a city manager in Rock Hill, SC (1948-1950). He died on February 13, 2003 and is buried in Cary, NC.</p>
4	21	<p>JEROME, JAMES EMMETT James Emmett Jerome was born in 1903 in North Carolina. Jerome was a Rock Hill city councilman (1948-1954, 1976-1978), a mayor of Rock Hill (1954-1957, 1978-1985), and a member of the South Carolina House of Representatives (1958-1961). He was also involved in the Town Center Mall and Cherry Park in Rock Hill, SC. He died on November 1, 1989 and is buried in Rock Hill, SC.</p>

4	21	JOHNSON, JEROME BONAPARTE Jerome Bonaparte Johnson was born in 1859. Johnson was a mayor of Rock Hill, SC who died in office (1922-1932). Before his political career, he also owned a drugstore in Rock Hill. He died on April 15, 1932 and is buried in Rock Hill, SC.
4	21	KENNEDY, WILLIAM MEEK William Meek Kennedy was born in 1907. Kennedy was a city manager in Rock Hill, SC (1951-1964). He died on March 4, 1996 and is buried in Rock Hill, SC.
4	21	LYLE, DR. DAVID Dr. David Lyle was born in 1879. He was a mayor of Rock Hill, SC (1934-1935). He died on October 25, 1936 and is buried in Chester, SC.
4	21	LYLE, DAVID David Lyle was born in 1913 and is the son of Dr. David Lyle. He was a mayor of Rock Hill, SC, beginning in 1964. He died on October 29, 1988 and is buried in Chester, SC.
4	21	MARSHALL, THOMAS CLAWSON Thomas Clawson Marshall was born in 1881. Marshall was a city manager in Rock Hill, SC (1933-1939). He died on June 11, 1960 and is buried in Rock Hill, SC.
4	21	RAUCH, JOHN JUNIOR John Junior Rauch was born in 1884. Rauch was a city manager in Rock Hill, SC (1939-1947). He died on April 22, 1955 and is buried in Rock Hill, SC.
4	21	RODDEY, JONH THOMAS John Thomas Roddey Sr. was born in 1865. Roddey was a mayor of Rock Hill, SC (1906-1912). He died on August 11, 1931 and is buried in Rock Hill, SC.
4	21	SPENCER, CHARLES WILLIAM FRASER Charles William Fraser Spencer Sr. was born in 1876 in York, SC. Spencer was a mayor of Rock Hill, SC (1913-1914), served as a Rock Hill city councilman, and also worked as an attorney. He died on February 20, 1956 and is buried in Rock Hill, SC.
4	21	STEVENS, DR. WILLIAM GILMORE Dr. William Gilmore Stevens was born in 1872. He was a mayor of Rock Hill, SC (1915). He died on May 12, 1948 and is buried in Rock Hill, SC.

4	21	WATERS, COL. JOHN JAMES Colonel John James Waters was born in 1848 in Chester, SC. He was a mayor of Rock Hill, SC (1899-1902), a member and later chairman of the school board, and worked in law and the real estate business during his life. He was also a Civil War Veteran. He died on May 30, 1911 and is buried in Rock Hill, SC.
