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FOREWORD

This is the second in a series of continuous Law Enforcement Plans for District III, the Central Piedmont Regional Planning District. It represents a substantial revision of the 1969 Plan, in both contents and format.

The data contained in the report are essentially the same type as that secured and analyzed by other District Commissions. It will be used, in part, to build the State Law Enforcement Plan.

The report methodology consisted principally of personal interviews with judges, magistrates, law enforcement officials, clerks of Court, Mayors, County Commissioners, work camp supervisors and probation officers. Court dockets and law enforcement records were researched, and questionnaires mailed on a limited basis.

The emphasis of this report is shifted from departmental needs and deficiencies, as discussed in the 1969 Plan, to regional (four county) problems, the Courts, and the regional approach to strengthening Law Enforcement systems.

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
