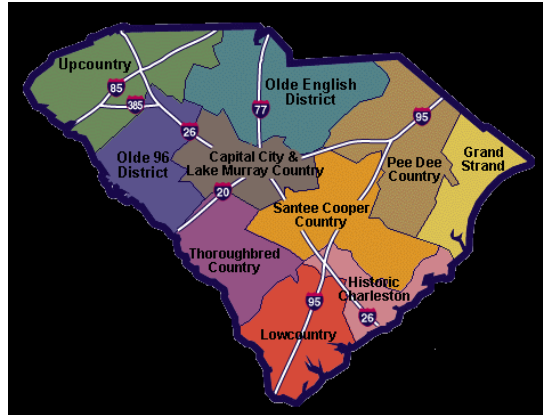

South Carolina 2008 Notable State Documents Awards

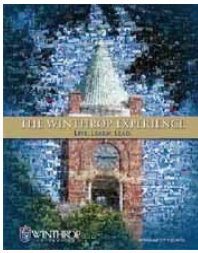
Each year the South Carolina State Library recognizes ten state governmental publications created during the past year for outstanding merit and usefulness to the citizens of South Carolina. The selection is announced annually on or near Freedom of Information Day, March 16th, the birthday of President James Madison, an early proponent of citizen access to government information. Librarians from state documents depository libraries around the state select the winners from 30 of the 2,500 items distributed to depository libraries last year.

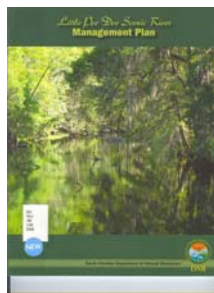


Faces of Homelessness: A Study of Homelessness in South Carolina.

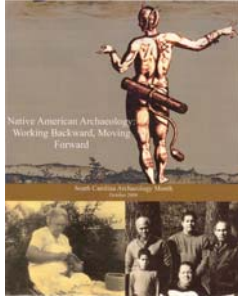

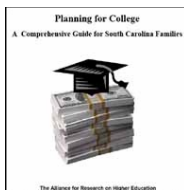

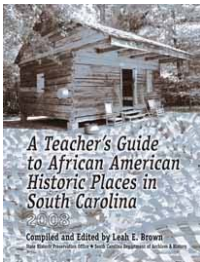
