Scope and Content Note: **Dr. Alice Henrietta Gregg (1893-1978) was a 1914 graduate of Winthrop College and she served as a Christian missionary to China from 1916 to 1950. The Alice Henrietta Gregg Papers in box one primarily consist of dissertation notes on Chinese culture, pamphlets, & magazines relating to China, a dedication book, drawings, pictures, a portfolio of Indian art, and a scrapbook (1950-1967) which contains some correspondence and biographical information. The collection in box 2 primarily consist of Dr. Alice Gregg's bible, a copy of her book titled: Hsin Hsin Yin; Hearts Touch Hearts, a book titled: Fifty Years in China, The Memoirs of John Leighton Stuart, Missionary & Ambassador, pictures, inspirational letters, note cards, newspaper articles referring to Dr. Gregg's missionary work in China, biographical articles and obituary notices, map of Anking, China.**

DR. ALICE HENRIETTA GREGG

- 1893 Born: Mars Bluff, South Carolina
- Attended country school with one teacher
- 1914 A.B. Winthrop College, South Carolina
- 1914-1916 Diploma, Church Training and Deaconess House, Philadelphia, Pa.
- 1916-1920 Taught in Anking, China
- 1920-1921 B.S. Teachers College, Columbia University
- 1921-1926 Supervisor of diocesan schools in thirty cities in southern Anhui and northern Kianhsi, China
- 1927-1928 M.A. Columbia University, Psychology
- 1928-1929 Attended Union Seminary and Teachers College, Religious education, winter semester
- 1929-1935 Secretary to Religious Education Committee of the Anglican Communion over thirteen dioceses, Anking, China
- 1935-1936 Attended Columbia University, winter semester
- 1945 Ph.D. Columbia University
- 1946 Dissertation published by Syracuse University Press: *China and Educational Autonomy*
- 1941 Winthrop College awarded her the Mary Mildred Sullivan Award, outstanding alumna
- 1942 Columbia University Medal awarded in recognition for Dr. Gregg's service in Shanghai, China and for starting a charitable fundraiser called, "Cup of Cold Water Fund"
